About our school motto

Docendo discimus is a Latin proverb which means "By teaching, we learn." It is said to be from a passage in a letter from the ancient Roman philosopher Seneca the Younger to his friend which is part of Epistulae morales ad Lucilium (Moral Letters to Lucilius).

Since the founder of the Tsuji Group Shizuo Tsuji opened the Tsuji Chef School (former name of the TSUJI Culinary Institute) in Osaka's Abeno Ward in 1960, our school motto *Docendo discimus* has been continuously passed down to our faculty to the present as an educational belief which embodies the idea of "By teaching, we learn" and its utilization.

In regards to the motto *Docendo discimus*, Shizuo Tsuji passionately and repeatedly stated the following: "A school is a place where faculty provide all their knowledge and skills to students through classes and where faculty themselves continually learn new things. The reason why students study is because faculty members are constantly studying. By nature, there is no end to learning in the culinary and patisserie fields, and this is why people working in those fields will spend a lifetime learning about them."

Docendo discimus are two words that represent our faculty's dignity and circumspect approach. These words also express the wish that graduates, to which this motto is passed on to, will continue to study on their own about the actual culinary and patisserie related work that they are involved in, and drive the development of the food industry as they train the next generation.

■ Process from Application to Pass/Fail Notification

1	Application	Please prepare and submit the documents for application during the application period.
2	Screening Phase	Applications are screened in the order they are received. After screening, applicants will be provided with an examination date via an examination admission postcard.
3	Entrance Examination	Both a written and an oral examination are given in Osaka. *If you require a visa to enter Japan, please acquire it on your own.
4	Pass/Fail Notification	Applicants will be informed of the results by letter within 2 weeks after the entrance examination.

Admission Procedures

Applicants who have passed the entrance exam are asked to complete the procedures outlined in steps 1 and 2 below within the designated time frames.

1	Submission of "Written Oath and Guarantee" and "Student Identification Card Information Confirmation Slip"	Submit these within 2 weeks after receipt of acceptance letter. These will be sent together with the acceptance letter. Please check the information, fill out all of the necessary items, and then send these documents back to the school. *For changes and updates to residence status (for foreign students), a certificate of admission issued after tuition has been paid rather than the acceptance letter is required.
2	Tuition Payment	Tuition is to be paid within 2 weeks after receipt of acceptance letter. As for payment methods, tuition can be paid in a lump sum, or in 2 or 4 installments. (Paying in installments does not change the total price of tuition.) For details regarding monetary amounts, etc., please refer to "■ Tuition, Payment Method and Miscellaneous Expenses (p. 50-51)." When remitting money for tuition payment from overseas, please include any fees charged by the intermediary bank and recipient bank. - Students in this course do not need to pay the France School entrance fee (150,000 yen) and program development fee (150,000 yen).
- For studying at the France School, in addition to the requirements previously listed, it is necessary for students to have overseas student insurance, round trip air tickets, living expenses during Stage training, etc.
- *Stage is a training program where students experience real training at local restaurants and patisseries after completing their studies at the French School. The Stage program is for students who have passed a screening process at the France School.

 Students in this course are not required to take an examination for entrance into the France School. While enrolled during their first year, students are able to take classes during that year that will help them in their overseas studies.
- Students in this course are not required to take an examination for entrance into the France School. While enrolled during their first year, students are able to take classes during that year that will help them in their overseas studies.
 In order to determine whether students will start in April or October, the school will look at the interest of the students, and refer to their tests at the school, attendance record, and homeroom teacher evaluation.
- During the first year of enrollment, an information session will be held on travel procedures, etc.
- Although this course is a prerequisite for studying at the France School, there are cases in which it is not possible for students to study abroad in light of their grades, number of days of attendance, health condition, and so on during the first year of enrollment. Note: Students are not able to receive scholarships from the Japan Student Services Organization (JASSO) to attend the Tsujicho Group's France School.

■ Tsujicho Group's Overseas Student Scholarship System

This scholarship system is designed for overseas students studying at the TSUJI Culinary Institute and the TSUJI Institute of Patisserie. Number of scholarships available: Available for a few students of the TSUJI Culinary Institute and a few students of the TSUJI Institute of Patisserie

Scholarship Amount: 150,000 per year (repayment not required)

Selection Process: Students who submit a scholarship entry sheet after entering the school will be considered for scholarships through a selection examination

Scholarship for Privately Financed International Students (Japan Student Services Organization (JASSO))

Number of scholarships available: Several (School is notified after the number of scholarships is determined by Japan Student Services Organization (JASSO))

Scholarship Amount: 48,000 yen per month (examples of amounts provided during the 2016 school year) (repayment not required) Selection Process: An information session will be held after entering the school and the selection examination for scholarship for Privately Financed International Students will be held.

Entry Withdrawal

After completing the application process, please contact the Entrance Information Office if you must withdraw from entering the school due to unavoidable circumstances.

Note: Tuition, including the entrance fee, will be reimbursed only if the accepted applicant is not permitted resident status before school entry. (The examination fee is not reimbursed).

●From the nearest stations


Eight minute walk from Tennōji Station (M23) which is accessible by JR or Midōsuji Line trains.



Foreign students currently residing in Japan do not need to fill out this form.

This information is needed so that the school can directly contact your family in your home country—not your Japanese guarantor—if a problem has arisen related to your school life, etc. after you have entered the school. Also, there are cases in which tuition needs to be remitted overseas to an account under a family name, and this information is necessary for an account name inquiry in such cases.

Please state how much of the 2,140,000 yen for the one-year program or the 1,886,000 yen for the two or three-year program (one-year tuition) that you will be applying for will be covered by your financial supporter, and how much will be covered by you. (Please make sure that the portion of your financial supporter and your portion add up to the relevant tuition amount.)

Please state how much of your living expenses after you enter the school will be covered by your financial supporter, and how much will be covered by you. Please calculate and write down the amount for 1 year, referring to how much you expect to use in 1 month.

Please convert the annual income of your financial supporter into yen and write this down here.

If a financial supporter will be paying for any of your tuition, please make sure to write down the name of the financial supporter and his/her place of employment. If the financial supporter is unemployed, please write down how he/she will cover your tuition and living expenses. In this case, not stating an annual income is acceptable.
